Violette's reply was to give her bed to Hortense and to sleep on the floor herself!! Hortense felt that this was how her life was saved.

A special prayer also for Lewis Gilbert, the director and producer of her film *Carve Her Name With Pride* (1958) who died 27th February 2018 aged 97.

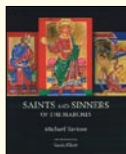

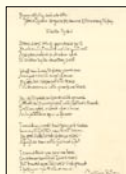

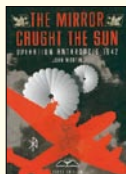
